

Lying to Law Enforcement and Refusing to Cooperate

In December 2005, A Lafayette Police Officer Stopped A Vehicle Carrying Bagsby And His Brother, Aaron, After Watching It Leave A Known Drug House. While No Arrests Were Made, The Officer Noted That A Small Amount Of Marijuana Was Detected, And Stated That Bagsby Was Not Cooperative And Was Likely Lying About The Backstory Of A BB Gun Carried By His Brother.

NARRATIVE:

This report was generated as a result of field observations during uniformed patrol in a marked police vehicle.

At the above date and time I, Officer ML Brown #340, was patrolling the area of 1100 Brown St. I saw a maroon 1993 Oldsmobile Cutlass pulled over in front of 1106 Brown St. The vehicle was running and a white female was sitting behind the wheel. There has been a history of drug law violations at this address and it is not uncommon for a driver and vehicle to be waiting outside for the subject buying drugs inside. Based on these circumstances, I believed that is what was happening at that time.

I pulled down the street and parked my vehicle in an inconspicuous position so that I could see the suspect vehicle, but I would not be easily seen by anyone else. After only a short time (1-2 minutes) I saw three black males exit 1106 Brown St and enter the vehicle. The vehicle then drove westbound on Brown St.

I caught up to the vehicle as it signaled to turn southbound onto 9th St. When I got behind the vehicle, it changed it's signal indicating it was going to turn northbound on 9th St. I noted that the license plate lamp on the vehicle was defective, making it difficult to see the license plate number.

I followed the vehicle as it turned northbound on 9th St, then activated my overhead lights to stop the vehicle for the license plate lamp violation. The vehicle yielded on Union St, just east of 9th St. I approached on foot and met with the driver, Erin Koch. I obtained ID from Koch and the three male occupants in the vehicle. Records checks revealed that the front seat passenger, Aaron Bagsby, had a previous arrest record for dealing Marijuana. Based on the fact that I suspect the occupants were visiting a drug house and that one of the occupants had a previous arrest for dealing Marijuana, I called for a K9 Officer to respond.

Officer Domkowski responded with his partner Kwando. I had each of the occupants step out of the vehicle and patted each of them down. Nothing was found during the patdowns, however, it is notable that Aaron Bagsby removed his coat while he was still in the vehicle, even though it should have been obvious that he was going to have to step out of the vehicle into the cold.

Officer Domkowski and I then conducted a search of the vehicle based on the probable cause established by Kwando's alert. Officer Domkowski located some shake (small bits of marijuana) in the glove compartment. There was insufficient quantity of shake to seize so nobody was arrested. I located a black Daisy Powerline BB gun in Aarons right front jacket pocket. This was the same jacket that I saw Aaron remove prior to getting out of the vehicle. The BB gun was designed to look like a short-barrel colt pistol. There were no orange markings indicating it was not real. The BB gun was unloaded and did not contain a CO2 cartridge, making it inoperable.

I asked each of the occupants independently, the purpose of Aaron possessing the gun. Aaron told me that he has

owned the gun since he was a child and that it had been stored at his mothers' house until tonight. Aaron further stated that he had picked up the gun tonight just to transport it to his own home. Richard Babsby said that he had given the gun to Aaron for his birthday just four or five days ago. When I inquired as to the extensive wear and tear on the gun, Richard said that it had fallen out of a window at his girlfriend's house out in the country. Richard refused to provide any information about his girlfriend's name or address, stating that it was none of my business. Shannon Moses told me that Aaron was taking the gun to go hunt a rabbit, that he had never eaten rabbit and wanted to shoot one tonight.

Because all three stories about the gun were obviously lies, I took the gun as property to prevent it from being used improperly.

Nothing else was located inside the vehicle. All subjects were released from the scene with the vehicle. Upon closed examination of the license plate lamp, I saw that it did have a working bulb, however, the light output was so low that it did not illuminate the plate sufficiently. I warned Erin for the lamp.

The BB gun was tagged #27607 and placed in the LPD property room.

No further action taken.

NARRATIVE:

On the above date and time, I, Officer J.M. Wilkerson (#332) was driving marked Lafayette Police car 8-137 and was wearing my Lafayette Police uniform. I was parked in the entry/exit for Riehle Plaza facing eastbound towards north 2nd Street and noticed the above vehicle driving northbound on 2nd Street as it passed me. I noticed the vehicle did not have a working license plate light.

I pulled behind the vehicle and followed it eastbound on Ferry Street and then northbound onto North 4th Street. I activated my emergency overhead lights and the vehicle stopped at the intersection of north 4th Street and North Street.

I approached the driver, identified myself, and the reason he had been stopped. The driver identified himself as Richard Roy Bagsby and handed me a laminated copy of his birth certificate. Bagsby told me that he did not have his driver's license with him, but that he did have a valid Indiana driver's license.

Lafayette Police Dispatch advised that Bagsby had an Indiana driver's license status of suspended infraction with an indefinite reinstatement date.

I issued Bagsby a written warning for the license plate light, and the above citation for driving while suspended. Bagsby and his passenger, Larry Boatwright, were released from the scene on foot.

I inventoried the vehicle and tagged it. I completed the state tow form and had the vehicle towed/impounded to/by Jim's Garage.

Lafayette Police Dispatch then advised that Bagsby was wanted on writ. Officer S. Swick (#319) located Bagsby and arrested him on the writ. For further information on the writ, see LPD2007-014299.

I then cleared the call.

While on marked patrol, I was dispatched to 3771 Laramie Dr to meet with complainant, Christen Couture, in reference to some money being stolen from her residence.

Upon arrival Christen advised me of the situation. She stated that at approx 03:00hrs this morning she and her friend Rick (unknown last name) came back to her residence to stay the night. She advised that at approx 05:00hrs she got \$20.00 from her nightstand drawer located next to her bed. I asked exactly where the money was located in the drawer, and she explained that it was in the corner of the drawer, underneath her underwear. She advised that when she got the \$20.00 out of her drawer, Rick saw the rest of the money that was in there.

Both Christen and Rick then went to sleep in her bedroom. She advised that she woke up around 13:00hrs and got in the shower. She stated that while she was in the shower, Rick yelled through the door that he was going to go to the Village Pantry to get something to eat, and then he was going to come back. Christen advised that she got out of the shower, and Rick had still not returned. She stated that she waited around for Rick to return until about 14:00hrs. Christen then stated when Rick did not return, she got the money out of her drawer and left the house. She advised that her rent was due, and she needed to go get a cashiers check to pay the rent. When she arrived at the bank she counted her money and realized that \$330 was missing. She then returned home and tried to contact Rick via the telephone. Christen stated that she spoke with one of Ricks family members, and they advised that he was not home. She then called the police.

I asked how long she had known Rick, and she stated for about a month. She advised she met him through her boss at work [REDACTED], Shannon Moses. She explained that Shannon was Rick's uncle, and he introduced them to one another. I had Christen call Shannon to try and obtain Ricks last name. She spoke with Shannon, and he would not give her Rick's last name. He told her that he was going to call him, and try to get the money back without getting the police involved.

Shannon called back after a short duration of time, and stated that Rick advised that he didn't take any money. Furthermore Shannon was reluctant to give Rick's last name, and advised Christen to go speak with Rick at his house.

Christen then called the Rick's residence, and spoke with one of Rick's brothers. He informed her that Rick wasn't home, and that they didn't know where he was at.

I then had Christen drive by and show me Rick's house. She pointed out 3107 South St. I then spoke with her briefly, advised her to return home, and told her if I gathered anymore information I would call her. Before she left she advised me that if Rick returned the money, she did not want to press charges.

I made contact with a B/M at the residence, and he identified himself as Richard Bagsby (he informed me that he goes by the name of Rick). Richard at first informed me that he didn't take the money, but after speaking with him further he admitted to stealing \$150 out of Christen's drawer. I then allowed Richard to call Christen on the phone. He spoke with her for a short duration, and then advised me that she wanted to speak with me. Christen then informed me that she did not want him arrested, and stated that they had come to a verbal agreement that he would pay her back the money within three days. The phone call was then terminated.

I asked Richard if he still had the money in his possession, and he stated that he did not. He advised that he used the money to pay his rent. I informed him that Christen reported that \$330 was taken, and he, "Swore on his mother" that he only took \$150.

I re-contacted Christen, and informed her that Richard stated that he only took \$150. She then confirmed that she

I then informed her that if Richard did not pay her back the money within the three days that she would have to take that up in small claims court. I explained to her that I was going to document the incident, and then I provided her with a case#. I then cleared the call.

assumed he had called Bagsby after leaving her hospital room. Lockard said her ex didn't make the threats over the phone reported by the nursing staff, although, she didn't hear the phone conversation, and was in a different part of the hospital than where the incident took place.

I told Lockard, at this point, no one was in trouble, but I just wanted to make sure her ex had calmed down, and see if he had said those words on the phone out of frustration, in the heat of the moment, or if he was serious about those verbalized threats. Lockard would still not provide me with any information on her ex. I asked her if she felt her child was safe with someone who had made these comments earlier, and she said she had no concerns reference the safety of her child, and didn't want to provide me with any information so I could do a check well being of her child, who she also refused to identify. Lockard said she has been split up from her ex for approximately nine months, and confirmed she has been with Bagsby for five months, but this is the only information she would provide on her ex-boyfriend, and father of her child.

I asked Lockard how her ex ended up at the hospital with her, if she was now with Bagsby. Lockard said she had told her ex earlier in the day she was coming to the hospital for an undisclosed medical problem, but she wouldn't elaborate on how he just happened to pick the exact time she was at the hospital to come up to St Elizabeth, and cause a disturbance.

Lockard was completely uncooperative throughout our conversation, and before clearing, I asked her one last time for the name of her ex, telling her that she was making it into a bigger issue than it needed to be, however, she still refused to provide any information. Lockard repeatedly told me to find out myself, and that she didn't have to give me any information, because she didn't call the police, and didn't want the police questioning her about something she denied happening, although, she wasn't witness to what was reported by the nursing staff.

I then stepped out of her hospital room to find that Bagsby was standing outside her hospital room in the hallway, and hadn't gone to the waiting room as instructed. I asked Bagsby if he had met up with her ex to exchange the child, and he said he did, but wouldn't say where they exchanged the child, nor if there was any type of altercation. Bagsby eventually did tell me the ex's name was either James or Jaime, lived on Earl Av near McDonalds, and he drove a Pontiac Grand Prix style vehicle. Lockard's old RMS address was listed as 627 N Earl Avenue.

It should be noted, Lockard was discharged just as I was getting ready to clear the hospital, and it was my understanding she would be leaving with Bagsby. After getting out to my squad car, I found that Bagsby's driving status is DWS-Prior, however, he and Lockard were already clear of the hospital by this time.

No further actions were taken on this day.

On the above date and time, I assisted the Street Crimes Unit and the Drug Task Force with a controlled purchase of crack cocaine in the area of 4th St and Romig St.

Sgt. Payne drove Detective Curwick, Officer Savage, and me to the area in an undercover vehicle. Detective Eager was undercover and going to make the purchase. He arrived at the scene and was met by an older black male at the corner of 4th and Romig. The black male entered Detective Eager's vehicle and they drove to the parking lot of an apartment complex at 425 Romig St.

Sgt. Payne drove our vehicle around to the northeast corner of the apartment building. In between the apartment buildings is a breezeway containing a set of stairs. Detective Goetz advised that Detective Eager was waiting on the dealer to show up and the dealer was going to be about 10 minutes.

As Detective Eager waited, people kept coming out of apartment # 7 in the east building. Three vehicles arrived at the apartment building, one of them being the dealer driving a green Chevy Blazer.

Once the deal was completed, Detective Goetz advised us over the radio. I exited the rear of the undercover vehicle and ran through the breezeway. Officer Savage ran around to the west end of the building. Detective Curwick followed me through the breezeway.

Once I entered the parking lot, I saw the dealer run toward the southwest corner of the lot. I came around Detective Eager's vehicle and observed the older black male and an older black female in the passenger's door. I ordered them to get on the ground. Once they were on the ground, the female began pointing to the green Blazer. There were 2 subjects sitting inside, later identified as Brandon Hill and Monica Walker. Brandon was sitting in the front passenger's seat and Monica was in the rear seat.

I advised other officers on the scene and told the two occupants to exit the car. I handcuffed Brandon and also handcuffed the older black male. Please see the initial report and other supplements for the identities of the older male and older female at the scene.

I then spoke with Brandon. He stated that he knows the dealer as "Will Dolla". He stated that he met him at the "club" and they have hung out. He called "Will" for a ride. He stated that he didn't know what was going on.

I then spoke with Monica. She stated that she only knew the dealer as "Will" and had also met him at the "club". She stated that she had been walking home with a lot of clothes and "Will" had stopped and picked her up to give her a ride home.

The dealer was not located in the area.

3/26/08 ~2:00am

Officer Dombkowski and I drove to 702 N 18th St to speak with the registered owner of the vehicle, Richard Bagsby.

At the residence, I knocked on the door. A male, identified as Richard Bagsby, answered the door. I asked if we could come in and speak with him. He stated that we could not, but he would come out and speak with us outside. He returned inside the residence to put a shirt on. Officer Dombkowski advised that he saw a female run from the front of the house to the back of the house.

Richard returned about a minute later and stepped outside. Without me asking him any questions, he stated, "I already know about my brother and my truck." He stated that a friend of his brother's called him and told him that the police had his truck and his brother was in trouble. Richard stated that his brother's name was William Campbell. He pointed to a maroon Oldsmobile with a temporary plate in front of the house. He advised that his brother had dropped off his car, the Oldsmobile, about an hour and a half before we arrived and had taken his Chevy Blazer. Richard stated that he had not talked to his brother, but had tried to call his brother's cell phone.

I cleared the residence with no further action taken.

On September 28, 2003, I, Officer Dobrin (316) was dispatched to 3860 B Harrow Court to speak with Winifred and Bryan Leap.

Winifred advised Bryan is mentally retarded with the emotional/mental capacity of an eight (8) year old. Bryan is semi-independent and has a caregiver with him most weekdays for approximately 40 hours a week. Bryan's caregiver is Jackie Scoggins with TLC Assisted Living.

Winifred stated she came over to see Bryan today and smelled something similar to ammonia. She showed me Bryan's checkbook in which Bryan wrote two (2) checks to a Richard Bagsby. Bryan banks with Lafayette Bank and Trust, account number 2076462. Check number 1580 was written on September 27, 2003 for \$30.00. Check number 1581 was written today for \$50.00. Bryan stated Bagsby comes to his apartment once in a while and always asks Bryan for money. Bryan always tells Bagsby he will not give him money, however, Bagsby pressures him until he finally gives Bagsby money. Bagsby has also tried to sell Bryan marijuana in the past and last night convinced Bryan to smoke a marijuana cigarette. Bryan became very upset and began to cry saying he was afraid he was going to be arrested because he was bad. I told Bryan I was not going to arrest him I just wanted him to tell me what happened. Bryan stated Bagsby came over to his apartment last night with a girl named Megan, his cousin Larry and another friend possibly Bagsby's brother. Bryan stated he knows smoking marijuana is bad but Bagsby convinces him to smoke it and to give him money. Bryan tells Bagsby "no" but Bagsby keeps asking for money until Bryan gives in. Bryan has smoked marijuana four (4) times with Bagsby.

Winifred stated Bryan is impressionable and desperately wants to make friends. Winifred spoke with TLC Assisted Living today after she found out from Bryan that Bagsby has been convincing Bryan to give money away. Starting Monday, September 29, 2003, Bryan will be receiving 24-hour a day care. I told Bryan that if Bagsby comes over to his apartment again and tries to convince him to do something he does not want to do Bryan should call us. Bryan stated he would call because he does not want Bagsby to do this to him anymore. Bryan will have a problem remembering a seven-digit phone number so I advised him that calling 911 would be fine.

Winifred stated she was taking Bryan home with her tonight and would be safe until his 24-hour care begins tomorrow. Bryan stated he has not given a key to his apartment to anyone.

Forward report to the Prosecutor's Office and to Adult Protective Services.
